## Notes from discussion:

- Understanding Snap! Connect and it's features - still not very clear to many what all it can do
- Need to do a better job at conferences explaining everything/having more available to show people
- ACTION: Savannah can make a small half sheet with a few points and/or screenshots to show people what it looks like and what features it has
- She can also be available to show people in person what it can do
- Share out school data to increase family understanding and pride in school progress - need to determine what that data should be and when to share it out.
- ACTION: Savannah and admin will determine what might be helpful and bring it to the November meeting. SAC members can request more information or other data from there.
- Idea to share out a communication preference survey for families - many are still preferring to get info from IC messenger or use email. This is okay but we need to continue to shift to one communication platform so its more consistent/less overwhelming to read about everything that is going on at school.
- Since Snap! Connect imports data from IC, can IC have something in there that links to Snap! Connect so parents understand the two are connected?
- ACTION: Savannah can ask district Infinite Campus staff about this.
- ACTION: Savannah will reach out to Snap! Connect IT to see if they can change to add instant or at least more customizable notifications for teachers on their computers- we all get the daily digest notification email and sometimes that creates a day or two delay in communication. The app is the only way to get instant notifications currently.
- Until we know if this is possible can continue to encourage teachers to check their Snap accounts daily.
- Revisiting conversation about traffic/speed in the neighborhood - the Lower Beaver Neighborhood Association is also looking into how to get a stop light added at the four way stop at Lower Beaver and Bel Aire. Amy shared about how there needs to be many, many different voices of people who do not work at Samuelson to get a traffic study done.
- ACTION: Savannah can give the traffic hotline number to Tabitha and she can recommend to that neighbors who call in about traffic/speed to call the number.
- Need to continue work on how to grow the SAC and make it look more like our school
- ACTION: Savannah is planning to hand out some personal invitations at conferences to draw more people to the November meeting.
- Family event times - should we be pushing some times back to start after 5pm? We haven't really received any explicit feedback from families about family event times.
- ACTION: Going forward we can start making sure to record attendance and the time of the event to look for patterns and see what works best for our families. We may even consider changing the time up on purpose to see what effect it has.
- Meet the Teacher Night is probably the most important family event of the year.
- ACTION: Extend the time frame next year and get a headcount to gauge how many families attend and what the issue might be if attendance is low (ex. Nervousness about not having school supplies).
- The more that attend this event the less stress there is on the first day of school.
- WORK IN PROGRESS: Need to communicate to school staff a mindset shift with family engagement. One of the responses on the staff survey last year said they saw family engagement as $100 \%$ attendance at all events. This is extremely unrealistic and we need to find a way to better align what teachers expect and what is realistic for our families without shaming families for it not being "good enough." Will also need to consider how cultural differences might affect family engagement.
- Volunteers - teachers aren't being vocal about volunteer needs as we've gone several years without having them in the building. Need to do a better job connecting volunteers with needs in the building and reminding teachers this is available to them.
- ACTION: Savannah will begin reminding teachers at weekly MTSS meetings to communicate volunteer needs and can share examples with teachers who want a volunteer but might not know what to use them for.


## GOAL AREAS FOR 2023-2024:

- Encourage usage of volunteers by school staff to increase volunteer engagement and help parent/guardian volunteers feel more comfortable being in the building.
- Through personal invitations and word-of-mouth, increase the number of parent/guardians on the SAC, ensuring the group is representative of the Samuelson student body demographic. Once accomplished, invite Samuelson community partners and other Samuelson staff to join the group.
- Continue to nurture family engagement and share feedback or education to school staff to ensure realistic expectations.
- Analyze school data, identify areas for improvement, brainstorm solutions and share successes with families.
